
Among current pretrial jail inmates assigned to Judge Morris:

- 89% of Black defendants (114 out of 128)
- 53% of Hispanic White defendants (29 out of 54)
- 75% of Non-Hispanic White defendants (38 out of 50)

Last week, among current pretrial jail inmates assigned to Judge Morris, 89% of Black defendants (114 out of 128 on an average night), 53% of Hispanic White defendants (29 out of 54 on an average night), and 75% of Non-Hispanic White defendants (38 out of 50 on an average night) were detained in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge Morris's racial difference in the share detained due to inability to pay for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 50% worst in Harris County. Her racial difference in the share detained due to inability to pay for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 50% worst in Harris County.
