
Among current pretrial jail inmates assigned to Judge Franklin:

- 84% of Black defendants (184 out of 219)
- 62% of Hispanic White defendants (78 out of 126)
- 71% of non-Hispanic White defendants (90 out of 125)

were detained per night based on inability to pay

Last week, among current pretrial jail inmates assigned to Judge Franklin, 84% of Black defendants (184 out of 219 on an average night), 62% of Hispanic White defendants (78 out of 126 on an average night), and 71% of non-Hispanic White defendants (90 out of 125 on an average night) were detained in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge Franklin's racial difference in the share detained due to inability to pay for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 50% best in Harris County. Her racial difference in the share detained due to inability to pay for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 50% worst in Harris County.



Track Judge Franklin's Share Detained Due to Inability to Pay

This report uses jail population data provided by Harris County. Share detained due to inability to pay represents the percent of current pretrial jail inmates assigned to this judge who were detained because they couldn't afford money bail.
